He has been a great teacher, mentor & guide to many senior perfusionists of today & also responsible for setting up the perfusion dept of many cardiac centres in the early eighties.

He enjoyed a very friendly rapport with many upcoming cardiac surgeons & anaesthetists as he would share a lot of tips & tricks gained from his vast experience in the operating theatre.

He was truly a very hardworking & dedicated professional & was bestowed with many awards during his tenure at Bombay Hospital.

Mr. Sri Krishna Laxman Desai was bestowed the Lifetime Achievement Award by ISECT in 2007 for his outstanding contribution to the ISECT. He was very active in perfusion services even in his post retirement days, however due to a sudden decline in his health condition he passed away peacefully on 14-3-2024
